Look at the Number 2

This week, we would like you to look at the number 2 and practise counting to 2, recognising number two and knowing that something represents number 2. Talk about the month being the second month of the year and the year is 2022.

Can you:

- Find a pair of socks or shoes and count 2
- Look for a number 2 in the environment (door numbers or car number plates)
 - Make 2 with bricks or toys
 - Draw a number 2
- Do 2 claps, 2 jumps, 2 hops, 2 nods
- Find 2 of the same parts on your body (arms, eyes etc.)?



Information for Parents/Carers:

In nursery, we are learning to recognise our numerals and we are developing being able to recognise up to 3 objects without having to count them. It is so important for the children to know that a numeral has meaning; it is a group of objects. To support your child further with their mathematics knowledge, you could sing some number songs, do lots of counting and encourage fast recognition of numbers without counting, such as 2 teddies, 2 cups, 2 shoes etc. For support with number songs, you can find some videos of number songs on our website, <https://www.parliamentfederation.co.uk/boston-nursery-school/parents/support-your-childs-learning/weekly-learning-videos>.

What your Child is Learning:

Develop fast recognition of up to 3 objects, without having to count them individually ('subitising'). (M3-4)

Say one number for each item in order: 1,2,3,4,5. (M3-4)

Know that the last number reached when counting a small set of objects tells you how many there are in total ('cardinal
