

Enjoy listening to longer stories and remember much of what happens.	Use a wider range of vocabulary.	Understand a question or instruction has two parts, such as: "Get your coat and wait at the door."
Understand 'why' questions like: "Why do you think the caterpillar got so fat?"	Sing a large repertoire of songs.	Know many rhymes, be able to talk about familiar books, and be able to tell a long story.
Use longer sentences of four to six words.	Start a conversation with an adult or a friend and continue it for many turns.	Use talk to organise themselves and their play: "Let's go on a bus you sit there I'll be the driver."
Personal, Social and Emotion	al Development	
Select and use activities and resources to achieve a goal.	Develop sense of responsibility and membership of a community. E.g. does your child offer to help with household tasks	Become more outgoing with unfamiliar people, in the safe context of their setting.
Play with one or more other children, extending and elaborating play ideas.	Share and take turns with others.	Increasingly follow rules, understanding why they are important.
Talk with others to solve conflicts.	Talk about their feelings using words like 'happy', 'sad', 'angry' or 'worried'.	Understand gradually how others might be feeling.
Physical Development		
Continue to develop their movement, balancing, riding (scooters, trikes and bikes) and ball skills.	Go up steps and stairs, or climb up apparatus using alternate feet.	Use one-handed tools and equipment, for example, making snips in paper with scissors.
Use a comfortable grip with good control when holding pens and pencils.	Start eating independently and learning how to use a knife and fork.	Show preference for a dominant hand.
Be increasingly independent as they get dressed and undressed, for example, putting coats on and doing up zips.	Be increasingly independent in meeting their own care needs, e.g. brushing teeth, using the toilet, washing and drying their hands thoroughly.	Make healthy choices about food, drink, activity and toothbrushing.
